- a. Frightened, terrified, exhausted, they ran from the creature.
- b. Amused, amazed, excited, he left the circus reluctantly.
- c. Confused, troubled, worried, she didn't know what had happened.

EXPLANATION:

A 3___ed sentence begins with three related adjectives, each of which ends in ___ed.

All 3 ___ed words must be followed by commas. Most ___ed words used to open this sentence type describe emotions e.g.

Horrified

Amused

Confused

3__ed sentences are therefore particularly useful when the writer is accentuating a character's emotions.

TEACHING TIPS:

For less able pupils a 2___ed sentence is still effective. The difficulty is always one of finding sufficient ED words for pupils to use! I display a poster in class with a broad range

of alpha-ordered adjectives ending in ___ed.

Pupils are encouraged to add to the poster when they find other examples. This could also be linked to pupils' use of a Thesaurus in the classroom.
